Checking the Serial Number

Turn off the power, then press and hold **STORE** + **M3** + **M4** and then press the power button to turn on the power. Check the serial number.

System Self-test

Enter Self-testing Mode

Connect power supply, then press and hold $\mathbf{STORE} + \mathbf{M2} + \mathbf{M4}$ and then press the power button to turn on the power.

* In the above step, it requires to press the power button so as to check the functionality of this button.

Operation Procedures

The procedures are applicable to all test items.

To shift between the test items:

Next item:

Press and hold **START/STOP** button, then press \land (right side of the panel) or

Press and hold **START/STOP** button, then rotate the data dial clockwise.

Previous item:

Press and hold **START/STOP** button, then press \checkmark or Press and hold **START/STOP** button, then rotate the data dial counter-clockwise.

To shift between the test procedures: Next step: Press ∧ or rotate the dial clockwise. Previous step: Press ∨ or rotate the dial counter-clockwise.

To start testing: (Test will start only when manually started) Press **1** button.

Automatic Testing

When entered, the LCD will show the following image:



The test includes:

USB flash drive (check the reading/writing function in the background) Nor Flash (check the reading/writing function in the background) SPI Flash (check the reading/writing/erasing function in the background)

SDRAM (check the reading/writing function in the background)

Press the **1** button to start testing; it will show all test results after the testing.

* Before pressing the **1** button, connect a USB flash drive to the USB connector (**TO DEVICE**).

If there is an error in the item, it will show the ERR interface. Use the \land / \lor to turn the pages.

The item that has not yet been tested will be marked with "----". If there is an error in the testing steps, the item name will be marked with "*".



If all are OK, the LCD will display the following image:



LED

When entered, the LCD will show the following image:



Testing procedures:

Press \wedge to switch to the next LED mode.

Press \checkmark to switch to the previous LED mode.

Inspect the LED lighting status.

LED modes:

1. All lit in red

2. All lit in green.

3. All lit in blue.

4. All lit in white.

5. All unlit.

LCD

When entered, the LCD will show the following image:



Testing procedures:

Press \land / \lor to switch the LCD images; inspect the display effect.

Press \wedge to switch to the next image.

Press \checkmark to switch to the previous image.

Pass: indicates the display effect is correct, no additional/lacking any pot, the display content is clear.

Fail: any case other than the Pass one.

Test images:

1. Full LCD is lit.

2. Full LCD turns off.

3. The dot matrix area shows ">".



4. The dot matrix area shows "<".



5. The dot matrix area shows "#".

Knobs (ADC)

When entered, the LCD will show the following image:



During the operation, the LCD will indicate the current value.

Testing procedures:

- 1. Turn the corresponding knob to minimum.
- Pass: hear a tone of "OK"
- 2. Turn the corresponding knob to maximum. Pass: hear a tone of "OK"
- 3. Center (only for the controller that has a central value) Pass: rotate/push the controller to the middle position, the LCD shows a central value (64), then jump to the next item (this central value of 64 has already been internally adjusted to include variations. This figure must be 64.)

Follow the above procedures to test the knobs in the following sequence (when a knob is finished testing, the system will automatically start the next one. The LCD will indicate the test item.)

Function Buttons

When entered, the LCD will show the following image:



Testing procedures:

Check the buttons strictly in the order form left to right, up to down, as indicated by the arrowhead in the image below.

Press the first button in this sequence to start testing the function buttons. At the same time, the LED of next button that is to be tested will be lit. Pass: hear a pass tone.

Fail: hear a fail tone.



Data Dial

When the function button test is finished and passed, it will automatically start the Data Dial test. When entered, the LCD will show the following image:

Testing procedures:

- 1. Rotate the data dial clockwise to increase the value.
 - Pass: when the value increase to 10, hear a pass tone.



2. Rotate the data dial counter-clockwise to decrease the value. Pass: when the value decrease to 0, hear a pass tone.



Keys

* This test item cannot be skipped in the middle of executing. When entered, the LCD will show the following image:

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Testing procedures:

Press the keys strictly from right to left (indicated by the arrowhead in the image below) using medium touch force.

Pass: hear a pass tone.

Fail: When pressing a wrong key or the touch force is not within range, you will hear an error tone.



The LCD shows the currently pressed key and the touch level.

Pedal

* Before entering this test item, connect the pedal switch to the **SUSTAIN** jack. When entered, the LCD will show the following image:



Testing procedures: Press the pedal. Pass: hear a pass tone. Fail: hear an error tone.

 $^{\ast}~$ If DP-2 is used, the pass or error tone sounds when releasing after pressing.

Audio

When entered, the LCD will show the following image:



- * When connecting headphones, Phone is displayed.
- * Note that sound is produced at high volume. It is recommended to connect to the monitor speaker and adjust the volume.
- * Pressing a key other than C4–C#5 will stop the sound.

Testing procedures:

- 1. Disconnect the headphones.
 - Pass: the LCD shows "Speaker"
- 2. Press the corresponding keys to hear the audio sound (from speakers). Pass: sound comes from speakers. No sound from headphones.
- 3. Connect the headphones.
- Pass: the LCD shows "Phones"
- 4. Press the corresponding keys to hear the audio sound (from headphones).
 - Pass: sound comes from headphones. No sound from speakers.

Turning Off

In this procedures, it requires to press the Power button to turn off the instrument so as to check the functionality of this button.

Pass: it turn off the power.

Fail: it cannot turn off the power.

Other description

Aux Out and Mic: in normal mode, check the sound to see if they work properly.
